

Correct Answers 1

Question 1 **Correct answer B**

Explanation: There is no penalty if a player causes her ball to move while trying to find or identify it. If the ball is moved during the search, the ball must be replaced on its original spot (which if not known must be estimated) (Rule 7.4).

Question 2 **Correct answer C**

Explanation: Since she started with 13 clubs, she was entitled to add another club under Rule 4.1b(1).

Question 3 **Correct answer C**

Explanation: If a player declares a wrong handicap and does not correct the mistake before the opponent makes a stroke, if the declared handicap is too low, there is no penalty and the player must play off the lower handicap (Rule 3.2c).

Question 4 **Correct answer B**

Explanation: See Rule 6.4a.

Question 5 **Correct answer A**

Explanation: A player may have only one caddie at any one time. See Rule 10.3a(1).

Question 6 **Correct answer A**

Explanation: The general penalty is loss of hole in match play and a two-stroke penalty in stroke play.

Question 7 **Correct answer B**

Explanation: See the definition of Honour.

Question 8 **Correct answer C**

Explanation: Damage on the putting green, which includes spike marks, may be repaired without penalty by taking reasonable actions to restore the putting green to its original condition (Rule 13.1c).

Question 9 **Correct answer B**

Explanation: The front edge of the teeing area is defined by the line between the forwardmost points of two tee-markers set by the Committee.

Question 10 **Correct answer B**

Explanation: A player has completed taking relief when a ball dropped in the right way comes to rest in the relief area. It does not matter whether the ball, after hitting the ground, touches any person, equipment or other outside influence before coming to rest. If the ball comes to rest in the relief area, the relief procedure is complete and the ball must be played as it lies.

Question 11 **Correct answer A**

Explanation: If a ball has been dropped in the right way twice and both times comes to rest outside the relief area, the player must complete taking relief by placing a ball on the spot where the ball dropped the second time, first touched the ground (Rule 14.3c).

Question 12 **Correct answer A**

Explanation: See the definition of Outside Influence.

Question 13 **Correct answer B**

Explanation: When starting a hole in match play, there is no penalty for playing from outside the teeing area, but the opponent may cancel the stroke and require the player to play from inside the teeing area (Rule 6.1b).

Question 14 **Correct answer A**

Explanation: See the definition of In Play.

Question 15 **Correct answer B**

Explanation: A concession is final - it cannot be withdrawn once it is made and it cannot be declined (Rule 3.2a).

Question 16 **Correct answer A**

Explanation: See Rule 15.2a.

Question 17 **Correct answer A**

Explanation: See Rule 3.2a.

Question 18 **Correct answer B**

Explanation: See the definition of Course.
