Question 1                      **Correct answer A**

Explanation: See Rule 3.2a.

Question 2                      **Correct answer A**

Explanation: See the definition of Penalty Area.

Question 3                      **Correct answer B**

Explanation: As the player has caused his ball to move, he gets a penalty of one stroke and must replace the ball.

Question 4                      **Correct answer A**

Explanation: See the definition of In Play.

Question 5                      **Correct answer B**

Explanation: As per the definition of Foursomes, this is a form of play where two partners compete as a side by playing one ball in alternating order on each hole.

Question 6                      **Correct answer B**

Explanation: A foursome is a match in which two players play against two other players, and each side plays one ball.

Question 7                      **Correct answer B**

Question 8                      **Correct answer B**

Question 9                      **Correct answer B**

**Question 12**                      **Correct answer A**

**Question 13**                      **Correct answer A**

Explanation: A concession is final - it cannot be withdrawn once it is made and it cannot be declined (Rule 3.2a).

**Question 14**                      **Correct answer B**

Explanation: See the definition of Equipment.

**Question 15**                      **Correct answer B**

Explanation: If a player declares a wrong handicap and does not correct the mistake before the opponent makes a stroke, if the declared handicap is too low, there is no penalty and the player must play off the lower handicap (Rule 3.2c).

Explanation: If a player's ball in motion accidentally hits any person or outside influence, including himself, there is no penalty and the ball must be played as it lies.
