

Correct Answers

Question 1 **Correct answer B**

Explanation: When starting a hole in match play, there is no penalty for playing from outside the teeing area, but the opponent may cancel the stroke and require the player to play from inside the teeing area (Rule 6.1b).

Question 2 **Correct answer A**

Explanation: See the definition of Equipment.

Question 3 **Correct answer B**

Explanation: A foursome is a match in which two players play against two other players, and each side plays one ball.

Question 4 **Correct answer A**

Explanation: Since she started with 13 clubs, she was entitled to add another club under Rule 4.1b(1).

Question 5 **Correct answer A**

Explanation: See Rule 10.1a.

Question 6 **Correct answer B**

Explanation: A concession is final - it cannot be withdrawn once it is made and it cannot be declined (Rule 3.2a).

Question 7 **Correct answer C**

Explanation: There is no penalty if a player causes her ball to move while trying to find or identify it. If the ball is moved during the search, the ball must be replaced on its original spot (which if not known must be estimated) (Rule 7.4).

Question 8 **Correct answer B**

Explanation: See the definition of Drop.

Question 9 **Correct answer A**

Explanation: See the definition of Loose Impediments.

Question 10 **Correct answer B**

Explanation: The general penalty is loss of hole in match play and a two-stroke penalty in stroke play.

Question 11 **Correct answer A**

Explanation: See Rule 3.2a.

Question 12 **Correct answer B**

Explanation: A player may have only one caddie at any one time. See Rule 10.3a(1).

Question 13 **Correct answer B**

Explanation: As per the definition of Foursomes, this is a form of play where two partners compete as a side by playing one ball in alternating order on each hole.

Question 14 **Correct answer B**

Explanation: A player may practice putting or chipping on or near the putting green of the hole just completed, but such practice strokes must not be made from a bunker (Rule 5.5).

Question 15 **Correct answer C**

Explanation: As the player has caused his ball to move, he gets a penalty of one stroke and must replace the ball.

Question 16 **Correct answer B**

Explanation: The front edge of the teeing area is defined by the line between the forwardmost points of two tee-markers set by the Committee.

Question 17 **Correct answer B**

Explanation: See the definition of Stroke.

Question 18 **Correct answer A**

Explanation: See the definition of Penalty Area.
